Who We Are

Anthem was formed through the 2004 merger of WellPoint Health Networks, Inc. and Anthem, Inc. Anthem's Government Business Division (GBD) serves members across the country through three business units: Medicare, Medicaid and Federal Government Services (FGS). In the past two years, the division has been strengthened to serve the high growth government managed care sector through two strategic acquisitions:

- **CareMore** Health Group was acquired in 2011 and is part of the Medicare business unit. CareMore's senior focused delivery model includes Medicare Advantage plans and unique neighborhood Care Center clinics designed to deliver proactive, integrated and specialized care to high risk and chronically ill individuals.
- **Amerigroup** Corporation was acquired in 2012 to position the Government Business Division to effectively and efficiently serve the growing state-sponsored business, including the Dual Eligibles, Seniors and Persons with Disabilities (SPD), and Long-Term Services and Support (LTSS) populations.
